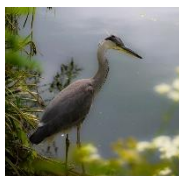

Wed 7 May, Waterstones MK, 7.00pm; £5

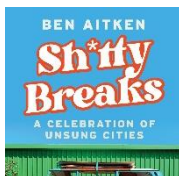
